

Guidelines & Directives to Jurors Scholarship Award Selection

Three jurors will be selected by the facilitator from among long-standing Colleagues of Calligraphy (COC) members and should include at least one charter member if possible. At least one juror will carry over to the next year.

Jurors will receive anonymous applications from the facilitator and will come to a consensus on how they would like to proceed with the selection process.

Jurors will have one month from the time they receive the applications to review, meet, deliberate and decide on the applications submitted. At the time they reach a decision they will inform the facilitator who will in turn inform any applicants of the jurors' decisions. All jurors' decisions will be final. The facilitator will keep a record of the number of applications and scholarship winners for respective years and provide that information to the Colleagues board of directors (BOD) secretary.

The jurors will use the Colleagues of Calligraphy *Mission Statement* (see below) to determine if the request falls within the precepts of the organization's stated purpose.

Jurors may choose one recipient to be awarded a scholarship of up to \$1,000, or in the event there are two exceptionally worthy proposals, a second scholarship of up to \$1,000 may be awarded in that same year. If no proposals are deemed worthy in a year, no scholarship will be awarded.
